Minutes of the regular council meeting held July 10,2023 at 6:00pm. Present council members Joe Buffington, Austin Miller, Ted Teel and Mary Moore. Mayor Sally Rodriguez, Public Works Director Josh Ferkel, Police Chief TJ Behning, Fire Chief Doug Anderson, Deputy City Clerk Judy Blessing and Tanna Leonard were present as well.

Meeting called to order at 6:00p.m. by Mayor Rodriguez.

### Pledge of Allegiance

# Consent agenda

Motion by Teel and seconded by Miller to approve the consent agenda. Carried unanimously.

### **Public Input**

Dave Stickrod asked if the newly appointed council member term would fulfill Brandon's term or if it would be on the ballot in November. Attorney McCullough explained that the vacant seat would only be until the end of the year and would be voted on in November.

Bonnie Wingate addressed the council about the length of time that fireworks are allowed to be set off. She explained that fireworks are not a huge deal to her but that it lasting for four days seemed excessive. She also brought with her a grocery sack full of detonated firework debris that she picked up from her yard. She asked if council would consider reducing the period fireworks are permitted. Wingate also addressed the safety issues with fireworks so close to homes.

Judy Hammons also asked that council reconsider the period that fireworks are allowed, she explained that they are coming from all directions and it's difficult with pets.

Mayor Rodriguez thanked Brandy and the Buffalo Day crew for all of their hard work planning and staffing the event. It seemed like everything went smoothly and the community enjoyed the event. The Fire Department did a great job with the fireworks.

She also reported that the corporate games were held in June and they thanked the community for allowing them to host their event at the beach. The turnout was a success.

Rodriguez said that she had contacted the representative from the railroad to see the issue regarding the trains parked for long periods of time along the tracks. The representative did not get back to her until this week because of the holiday and said that would check to see what is going on.

Tim Guizar reported that they would be having another RAGBRAI meeting and were still looking for volunteers to help for the event.

#### **Appointment of Council Member**

Mayor Rodriguez explained that Council Member Brandon Berg resigned from his seat and that the council decided to appoint someone to fill his vacancy. Rodriguez asked if those that were interested in appointment would stand, introduce themselves, and explain why the wanted to be appointed to the vacant seat.

Rachel Teel-Vanderpool introduced herself as a resident that grew up in Buffalo and that she had deep roots in the community. She would like to see some improvements; she has been attending meetings and feels she has a good idea of things going on.

Sean Roman introduced himself as a newer resident in Buffalo, married into the Teel family. He is a retired detective from Moline, II and has a good idea of how government runs and interacting with the public. He would like Buffalo to improve like LeClaire or Blue Grass but in its own unique way.

Brian Briggs introduced himself as someone that has lived in Buffalo most of his life. He would like to see things like the streetscape and other improvements in the community.

Tim Guizar introduced himself as a longtime resident with history in Buffalo from back to 1949 and really loves the community. He would like to see improvements and work with the other council members to improve the bad stereo type that Buffalo carries.

Dusty Chaplin introduced himself as growing up in Buffalo and is a member of the Volunteer Fire Department. He would like to see improvements in the parks and streets, and see development of housing and business.

Steve Sparbel introduced himself as growing up in Montpelier and living in Buffalo for the last 15 years. He would like to see some changes and that things seem stagnant. He would like to see more businesses, splashpad, and more improvements.

Teel explained that he was only approached by Steve Sparbel and promised to support his request for the vacant seat, and that was his motion.

Motion dies for lack of a second.

Motion by Moore to appoint Rachel Teel-Vanderpool to the vacant position. Motion was seconded by Teel and carried unanimously with Teel abstaining as he is related.

Mayor Rodriguez gave Rachel Teel-Vanderpool her oath of office and she took her seat.

## **Community Development**

Angie Gadzik explained that the committee met and discussed funding options for the Street Scape. She explained that they are wishing to apply for TAP funding in the fall but need community guaranteed match. The committee is proposing that the council earmark \$150K for FY24 and \$175K for FY25 for match funds. Council discussed the balance of funds, street scape, and planned funds.

### **Resignation of FT Officer**

Sergeant Bujalski submitted a resignation as FT officer and requested to remain a PT officer moving forward, as he has accepted a different position.

Motion by Teel and seconded by Buffington to accept Bujalski's resignation and accept his request for PT employment. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **Hiring FT Officer**

Motion by Miller and seconded by Teel to post for the FT Officer position. Motion carried unanimously.

# Casey's Liquor License

Motion by Teel and seconded by Miller to approve the liquor license for Casey's. Motion carries unanimously.

#### **CP Merger Agreement**

The agreement was discusses and it is a confidential agreement so not all points were discussed publicly. Motion by Teel and seconded by Miller to not accept the agreement as presented and request amendments for the amounts. Motion carried unanimously.
