



Buffalo Fire Department's Capital Plan

The Capital Improvement Plan for the Buffalo Fire Department, is a plan that projects future capital spending. There are two time frames projected within the plan. They are Short Term and Long Term projections. The following paragraphs explain the planned capital projects and the proposed expenditures.

Short Term – The short term plan covers the next budget year, which in this case would cover the period from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026. We will be focusing on the maintenance on the building which is over 20 years old, the equipment and having the best training for our members so we can give the citizens of Buffalo and the fire protection district the best service they expect and deserve.

Long-Term - The Long-term plan covers a time frame two fiscal years and longer into the future, which in this case would cover from July 1, 2025 on into the future. Our long term plan is a commitment to the citizens and businesses of the City of Buffalo and the fire protection district. The ongoing commitment to

budget for capital/equipment and new standards is necessary to maintain operations of the department. However, the Tanker will be 23 yrs old which needs to be replaced within the next 2 years. Engine 1 will be 20 years old in 2034 and with that said we will continue to budget to replace when needed. With the service life of our air bottles and packs being 15 years they will all need to be replaced by December 2026, due to manufacturer specifications. With that said we will always keep budgeting for future costs on keeping our members and our equipment up to date so we can provide our citizens and businesses of Buffalo and the fire protection district the best Fire service they deserve.
